Chef Jonathan Scinto is a bold, genre-defying chef, television host, executive producer, and entrepreneur known for his unapologetic, flavor-first philosophy and his signature **Itasian** cuisine—a fearless fusion of rustic Italian roots and deep Asian influences. Raised between Queens and Long Island, Jonathan's culinary identity was shaped by a true melting pot of cultures, giving him both an adventurous palate and a high-energy, no-nonsense style that cuts through traditional food television.

In the early 2000s, Chef Jonathan co-owned and operated a 40-seat Long Island café, Home Cookin Cafe, well before farm-to-table became industry shorthand. The café was proudly scratch-made to table, built on house-made ingredients and farm-fresh products sourced from local Long Island businesses. That hands-on experience laid the foundation for Jonathan's lifelong commitment to ingredient integrity, local sourcing, and cooking with purpose.

Jonathan later expanded his reach beyond restaurants, spending five years working at a culinary school where he served in the admissions department and helped create and launch recreational cooking and baking programs. This role strengthened his ability to connect with aspiring cooks, clearly communicate culinary concepts, and design engaging food education experiences—skills that later translated seamlessly into television, live events, and audience-driven content.

Chef Jonathan gained national recognition on **FOX's MasterChef Season 6**, earning a **Top 40 finish**. A key driving force behind that transition was his wife, Ann, whose belief and support inspired Jonathan to step beyond the traditional kitchen and pursue opportunities in television, storytelling, and brand-building. He has since competed on **Food Network's Chopped ("Better Duck Next Time")** and competed live at **Iron Chef: Autumn Bounty Battle Live**. He has also showcased his food at the **New York City Wine & Food Festival**.

A fierce competitor with a strategist's mindset, Chef Jonathan is a **back-to-back runner-up in the Chef Category at the World Food Championships**. Competing alongside Chef Ricky Robertson as the award-winning team **2 Brotha's from Anotha**, they are recognized for pressure-proof execution, bold flavor combinations, and elite-level precision.

Chef Jonathan currently serves as the host and executive producer of **At Home with Chef Jonathan**, a raw, unfiltered cooking-talk hybrid that flips the script on polished studio food TV. He is also the star of **Family Kitchen Revival**, now streaming on Tubi.

Behind the camera, Jonathan is the founder of JS Entertainment, where he develops chef-driven food and lifestyle programming designed for today's multi-platform audience. His work focuses on evergreen storytelling, digital-first distribution, and meaningful brand partnerships.

Chef Jonathan is also the author of **Unleash Your Personal Brand: A Step-by-Step Guide For Beginners**, available on Amazon, where he shares practical strategies for building influence and longevity in media and business.
